

# **Bikes, Scooters and Skateboards**



Help is available for non-English speaking parents and students.

#### **RATIONALE**

Students travelling to and from school need to be safe. Bicycles, scooters and skateboards are popular means of transport for students but require regulation and management.

#### **AIMS**

To provide a school environment that is safe for students, practical, and balances the rights of individuals with the schools' duty of care toward all staff and students.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

- Bicycles, scooters and skateboards are prevalent means of transport for students but are also often involved in serious accidents.
- It is well recognised that young children have underdeveloped motor skills, peripheral vision and judgement.
- All parents will be aware of these school rules and the safety reasons supporting them.
- Students who contravene these requirements but ride bicycles to school cannot bring their bikes onto school property or store their bicycles at school.
- Road rules and safety will form part of the school curriculum.
- Scooters may be ridden to school by students wearing helmets and must be stored inside the school bike shed or in classrooms with teacher permission.
- Skateboards may be ridden to school by students wearing helmets and must be stored in the school bike shed.
- Bicycles, scooters or skateboards cannot be ridden inside the school grounds between 8:00 am 3:45 pm.
- Students who break school rules will be managed consistently with the student discipline policy.
- Our school will provide safe storage for bicycles, scooters and skateboards ridden to school by students under the following conditions:
  - o Students wear helmets
  - o Bicycles are in a roadworthy road-worthy

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school's website.
- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Included in staff handbook/manual
- Discussed at annual staff briefings/meetings
- Included in transition and enrolment packs



- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions
- Reminders in our school newsletter
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
